

Submission of Entries

Entries must be on current official ASCA entry forms appropriate for the specific area of competition and MUST BE SIGNED. Blank entry forms are available at the end of this premium and are available for download at www.asca.org. No facsimile, telephone, incomplete, email, or computer entries will be accepted. IF YOU USE OVERNIGHT MAIL, YOU MUST WAIVE SIGNATURE.

Entrants are responsible for errors on entry forms and no entry fee will be refunded in the event of such errors. No entry shall be made, and no entry shall be accepted which specifies any conditions as to its acceptance. Entry information will be used to create the 2020 Nationals catalog; please make sure entries are legible and correct. Please include your dog's titles for them to be accurately presented in the catalog.

AGILITY - Entry is on a first-come, first-served basis by postmark date. Please mail a copy of the approved height card with the trial entry form.

STOCKDOG - Entry is on a first-come, first-served basis by postmark date; an official waiting list will be maintained.

Payment of Entry Fees

Make checks or money orders payable in U.S. funds to "ASCA Nationals." Foreign entries must be paid with funds drawn on a U.S. bank. **DO NOT SEND CASH**. Entries received without proper fee payment will not be accepted. Returned checks do not constitute a valid entry, and an NSF fee of \$35.00 will be charged. Credit card payments will also be accepted, subject to a 4% fee. If entries are cancelled before the closing date, we will retain a \$5 processing fee. Credit card payments should use the form attached in the premium, please be sure to sign. Once entries are processed, the credit card form will be shredded.

Proof of Age & Vaccination

A COPY OF ASCA REGISTRATION PAPERS MUST ACCOMPANY ALL ENTRIES FOR DOGS OVER 6 MONTHS OF AGE. The age of the dog will be calculated as of OCTOBER 23, 2020. Please be sure to have proof of rabies vaccination.

Confirmation of Entry

A confirmation letter will be emailed immediately following the completion of processing your entries. Please check your confirmation thoroughly! If you want your dog's titles listed, you are responsible for listing those titles, as the entry clerk does not have access to the ASCA database. CHANGES WILL NOT BE MADE AFTER September 20, 2020. Confirmation of receipt does not constitute an accepted entry. Entry information will be used to create the 2020 Nationals catalog; please make sure entries are legible and correct. Please be certain your email address is legible so we can send your confirmations.

Refunds

Entry fees will not be refunded if a dog is absent, disqualified, excused by a veterinarian or judge, or barred from competition by action of the Show Committee. If, because of riots, civil disturbances, or other acts beyond the control of management, it is impossible to open or complete the show, no refund of entry fees will be made.

Cancellation Policy

Cancellation of entries, RV/camping space, advertisements, vendor space, and all other items must be in writing and postmarked no later than August 31, 2020. **No refunds will be given for requests postmarked after** August 31, 2020, with the following exceptions: (1) a tracking entry that is pulled prior to the start of the test which can be filled with an official alternate, or (2) stock entries that are withdrawn and filled from the waiting list. These two exceptions will have their entry fees refunded.

Arrival / Move-Out Information

The grounds will open at noon on Friday, October 23. Early arrivals will line up in locations indicated in your confirmation packet and wait to be parked on the grounds. Instructions will be sent with reservation confirmation. Registration packets will be available for pick-up in the Nationals Office in location indicated on the sitemap included with your confirmation packet. Signs with stall/grooming space assignments will be posted.

RVs must depart by 9:00 PM on Saturday, October 31, unless staying an additional night (includes an additional \$50.00 charge, paid in advance).

GEORGIA INTERNATIONAL HORSE PARK RULES

- All dogs must always be crated or on a leash, except when competing in events.
- 2. Exhibitors must pick up after their dogs and use the orange buckets designated for dog waste.
- No dog washing in the isles in the barns. There are wash stations with tubs.
- 4. No glass bottles or glasses anywhere.
- Be aware of the horses as we will be sharing the facility with a horse show.
- 6. Keep your grooming space clean.
- 7. No outside food or drink.

Finals Information

The ASCA Business Office will contact qualifying participants with invitations, fees and directions for entering Finals. Send all entries and fees directly to the ASCA Business Office by the stated deadline. DO NOT SEND ANY Finals entries to the Nationals Entry Clerk.

Agility Finals - Please read the Finals section of the ASCA Agility Rule Book. At the completion of the Agility Finals, after all scores have been tallied, the ASCA Agility Finals Awards will be presented in the Charles Walker Arena on October 25.

Conformation Finals - Please read Chapter 15 of the Conformation Rule Book. The presentation of the Top Ten Awards for Altered and Intact will follow the completion of the Finals event in the Exhibition Hall on Oct. 26.

Junior Handling Finals - Please read Chapter 11 of the Junior Handling Rule Book. Use a separate entry form for your Finals entry and mail it to the ASCA Business Office. A change of dogs must be made at least one hour prior to the judging of the class and be approved by the Junior Chairperson and at least one other Show Committee or ASCA official. The "Keely Bryan Memorial Scholarship" is given for Finals Best Junior and Finals Reserve Junior. Awards will be presented in the ring at the completion of each class. Junior Finals Awards and the 500 Club Parade will take place immediately upon the completion of Junior Finals competition on October 26 in the Exhibition Center.

Obedience Finals - Please read Chapter 10 of the Obedience Rule Book. Bitches in heat can compete, see Section 9. Upon completion of the Obedience Finals and after all scores have been tallied, the ASCA Obedience Finals Awards will be given in Exhibition Center on October 26.

Rally Finals - Please read Chapter 13 of the Rally Rule Book. Bitches in heat can compete, see Section 2. Upon completion of the Rally Finals and after all scores have been tallied, the ASCA Rally Finals Awards will be presented in the rally ring in Exhibition Center on October 27.

Stockdog Finals - Please read Chapter 12 of the Stockdog Rule Book. The random draw for run order of the Elimination go-round will be done by the Business Office after entries close. If there is a day-of scratch and an alternate is used to replace the scratch, the alternate will have the same draw for run order as the dog being replaced. Final go-round run order will be random draw assigned to the placing rank of the Elimination go-round total scores. Five to 10 head of livestock will be used for each run. Sheep will be hair; cattle will be commercial beef crosses; ducks will be Khaki Campbell.

<u>Day 1 - First Elimination Round</u>: Handlers meeting at 7 AM, Course B, Cattle - clockwise, Sheep - counterclockwise and Ducks - clockwise. <u>Second Elimination Round</u>: To begin after a short lunch break or at the discretion of the Nationals Trial Committee, Course G, Cattle - clockwise, Sheep - counterclockwise and Ducks - clockwise

<u>Day 2 - Final Round</u>: Handlers meeting at 7 AM, Course G Cattle - clockwise, Sheep - counterclockwise and Ducks - clockwise. The Stockdog Finals Awards will be presented at the conclusion of competition, after scores have been tallied, on October 25 and 26.

Nationals Competition Information

Conflicts

If you have a conflict with events, conformation takes priority. Notify ring stewards 30 minutes before the ring starts to get scheduling worked out. We will try to be accommodating, but we must know you have a conflict. If you do not make it to your run by 30 minutes after the completion of the class, we will not look for you, and you will forfeit your run.

Stock: You must run your stock runs within the day you are shown in the run order.

<u>Agility, Obedience and Rally</u>: We will allow you to run out of order, but you must run within the allotted time for the class and the 30-minute rule will apply to all.

Please check in with all stewards at the individual venues at the beginning of the day so that they know you plan to compete.

Most Versatile Australian Shepherd

The Most Versatile Aussie Award is offered to recognize the dog that best combines the attributes of working ability and trainability and that faithfully represents the Breed Standard. The MVA conformation evaluations will take place Monday, October 26, and Tuesday, October 27. The Versatility Chairperson and MVA Show Committee are solely responsible for Versatility record-keeping from start to finish. The competition will be conducted using the rules in Chapter 1 of the MVA Rules and Regulations. Bitches in season will run at the end of each class (or as posted) with the same requirements as listed in the Agility/Obedience/Rally Finals and Tracking rules. The 2020 Most Versatile Aussie award will be presented Friday at the banquet. The Joseph Hartnagle Memorial Award and the Jean and Bob Carrillo Memorial Award will be presented to the Most Versatile Aussie. To find the MVA Rule Book, go to www.asca.org, click the Quick Links tab on the right side, choose Rules & Forms, then choose Rule Books, and then choose MVA/HOF/VCH/PCH Rules. Please note the section on Conflicts. We will be as accommodating as we can be, but you must let us know you have a conflict in order for us to work with you.

Most Versatile Junior

This award is for the Junior Handler who has the highest combined scores in MVJ evaluation, stock dog and the performance events. The dog must be owned or co-owned by the Junior or his/her immediate family and the co-owned dog must reside in the junior's home 75% of the year. The Most Versatile Junior competition will be conducted in accordance with Section 8.7, Rules for Holding a Most Versatile Junior Competition, of the Junior Showmanship Program Rule Book. Please write a short 100-word description of the Junior and his/her dog to be read at the MVJ awards presentation on Friday at the banquet. The Sandy Tubbs Memorial Award will be given for the Most Versatile Junior.

Agility

Entry is on a first-come, first-served basis by postmark date. All entrants must be in good standing with ASCA and no entry will be accepted for any dog or handler disqualified from the ASCA agility program. The Nationals trial is one trial held over three days and will be held on groomed dirt; two of the three rings are under cover. The trial will be judged by three judges,

judging in three rings, with a limit of 450 runs per judge per day. Obstacles used during the trial are defined in the ASCA Agility Rule Book. The obstacles that will be made available to the judges include: dog walk, Aframe, teeter, open tunnel, tire jump (displaceable), weave poles (24" spacing), non-winged jumps, winged jumps, and double jumps. All contacts have rubber surfaces. Contacts do not have slats. Electronic timing equipment will be used. The use of toys will not be allowed. Check-in, schedule and start times will be sent with confirmation of entry. Move-ups for the Nationals trial close on October 21, 2020. Rings will be fenced. Weave poles and a jump will be provided for warm-up. There is adequate crating space available around the agility ring area for competing dogs. In order for the trial to run smoothly, we need helpers. Please consider volunteering and fill out the coupons found following the Submission Form. Measuring Policy - All dogs measuring 20" or less at the withers, not jumping in the highest jump height, must provide proof of measurement (ASCA, AKC, NADAC height cards) or must be measured. Dogs in the 20" +/24" Standard Division classes,

Veteran Dogs or ACE Standard Division dogs entered in the 16"+ classes and ACE Senior dogs in the 12"+ classes do not need to provide proof of measurement. Please mail a copy of the approved height card with the trial entry form. Awards - 1st through 6th place class placement rosettes. ASCA Green rosettes for qualifying score. Overall HIT for Standard Division; Overall HIT Standard 10+, HIT Standard for Novice, Open, Elite; HIT Junior Handler, Champion of Record, Rescue and Veteran Dog; Overall HIT ACE Standard and Senior Division. High In Trial Awards will be calculated using the formula outlined in the ASCA Agility Rule Book.

Conformation - Altered, Intact, & Non-Regular

Conformation will be held in the Exhibition Building on mats. No grooming or setups will be allowed within the conformation building. Dog and Bitch schedules will be posted on the website and will be available in the welcome packet. Class schedules are subject to change. Updates will be posted at www.asca2020.com, on our Facebook page, and/or at the Show Office. Judges will not wait for any dog holding up a class, except for the Bred-By class. Bred-By handlers with conflicts must have made the ring steward aware of the conflict at least 30 minutes prior to the start of

the Bred-By class. Bred-By handlers with conflicts must have made the ring steward aware of the conflict at least 30 minutes prior to the start of the class. Owners or agents are responsible for having their dogs at the ring when their classes are called to be judged. The Host Club, 2020 Nationals Consortium nor their show committee is responsible for or obligated to furnish any service of notifying exhibitors of the start of class judging. Dogs will enter the ring in catalog order, unless otherwise posted. A maximum of 175 dogs/bitches will be judged by any one judge on any one day. If entries warrant, the Conformation Secretary reserves the right to divide classes into groups. In such cases, the judge will designate which entrants will return for class placements from each group.

Awards include rosettes for 1st through 6th class placements for all regular and non-regular conformation classes, BOB, BOS, BOW, WD, WB, Reserve WD, Reserve WB, and Premier Dogs and Premier Bitches.

Conformation - Non-Regular

<u>Puppy</u>: 4-6 Month Puppy class shall be for dogs that are four months but under six months of age, calculated as of October 23, 2020. These classes will be divided by sex, merle and solid color. The winners of these classes shall compete for Best of Breed Puppy and Best of Opposite Sex Puppy. These puppies may be altered. Please note that puppies are shown at the owners' risk with regard to communicable diseases;

owners/exhibitors are assuming responsibility for the risk inherent in showing puppies in a situation where risk of contracting a communicable disease is higher.

<u>Veterans</u>: This is open to dogs which have reached their seventh birthday as of October 23, 2020. This class is open to intact or spayed and neutered

dogs and will be divided by sex and by age: 7-10 years, 10-13 years, and 13+ years. All winners of these classes will compete for BOB Veteran and BOS Veteran.

Stud Dog / Brood Bitch: See section 4.14 b and c of the Conformation Rule Book. Two to four "get" of the dog or bitch, at least two of which must be entered in a regular conformation class. Dogs and bitches shown as progeny cannot be entered in this class themselves. Stud Dog or Brood Bitch entered may be neutered.

<u>Brace</u>: Two dogs shown together, which must look alike and move as one. See section 4.14.d of the Conformation Rule Book.

Stockdog Class: Altered or intact, judged together; divided by sex; must have received confirmation of a WTCH or FTCH title. This is a non-regular class. Best Stockdog and Best of Opposite Sex Stockdog will be awarded. Foreign Bred Class: A NON regular class ... all entrants must be born outside the continental U.S.A. including Alaska and Hawaii. The class will be divided by sex BOB Foreign Bred and BOS Foreign Bred will be awarded. This Non regular class will welcome and showcase our Aussies from around the World who come to the ASCA Nationals.

<u>Puppy Sweepstakes</u> is open to all Australian Shepherds that on October 23, 2020 will be 4 months of age and under 18 months of age. Indicate your sweepstakes class with the age division in the space provided for "Additional Class." Champions of record may be entered in Sweepstakes. The following classes will be provided for both dogs and bitches 4-6 solid, 4-6 merle, 6-9, 9-12, 12-15, 15-18 Months.

DIVISION OF ENTRY MONEY AS PRIZES - Only 1st through 4th will be awarded in Puppy Sweeps.

Awards include rosettes for Best Junior Handler, Reserve Junior Handler, and 1st through 6th class placements. Participation rosettes for Pee-Wee and Sub-Junior exhibitors.

Dock Jumping

Open dock all day Wednesday. Seven (7) Launch and two (2) Fetch It Classes on Thursday and Friday. Open Dock between Launches if time permits. Dogs must be over six months of age to be eligible to compete. The dock will be outside. Please be aware of all weather. Dock will be open in rain but not thunderstorms. This is an ASCA sanctioned event and will be governed by the rules of the Australian Shepherd Club of America®. Awards. 1st through 6th place in each division will be awarded per

Awards. 1st through 6th place in each division will be awarded per Launch/Fetch it Classes. Rosettes will be awarded for 1st place in Bonus Round Divisions. Rosettes will be awarded for High in Trial Regular, Veterans, Rescue and Jr Handler. No awards will be mailed.

Open Dock - \$15 per dog per day. Open dock is for people just wanting to practice/try it. If you have registered that day of competition, you do not need to pay for open dock to get in more practice in between launches. No pre-entry on Open Dock.

Obedience

Obedience will be in the Exhibition Building on mats. Classes offered will be Utility A & B, Open CDX A & B, Open ODX A & B, Novice A & B, Beginner Novice A & B, Team and Seniors (Novice exercises). The trial begins with group exercises for regular, optional titling, and non-regular classes to be held that day, followed by individual exercises in each regular, optional titling, and non-regular class. Bitches in season will compete pursuant to ASCA Obedience Rules, Section 1.13. Please notify the Obedience Secretary as soon as possible if you are competing with a bitch in season at least 30 minutes before the trial begins. Individual exercises will run in jump height and catalog order to the extent possible; adjustments may be made to accommodate conflicts. Enter on the official ASCA Obedience entry form. Should the number of entries warrant hiring an additional judge, this will be indicated in your confirmation of entries. Move ups will be taken on Monday, October 26; see schedule for details. Awards will include rosettes for 1st through 6th place class placements, qualifying scores rosettes, High in Trial, High Combined (Open B and Utility), High in Trial Veteran, Conformation Champion of Record, Rescue and High in Trial Junior.

Rally

Rally will be in the Exhibition Building on mats. Classes offered will be Novice C/B/A, Advanced C/B/A, Excellent C/B/A, Masters C/B/A, and Team Relay Rally (Advanced Course). Bitches in season will compete pursuant to ASCA Rally Rules, Sections 14.5 and 14.6. Dogs will run in jump height and catalog order to the extent possible; adjustments may be made to accommodate conflicts. Team Relay Rally will be an Advanced course. All dogs are eligible for Team Relay Rally regardless of their titles. Enter on the official ASCA Rally entry form. Move ups will be taken on Monday, October 26; see schedule for details.

Awards will include rosettes for 1st through 6th place class placements, qualifying and X-qualifying scores, High Score Masters, High Score Excellent, High Score Advanced, High Score Novice, High Combined Score in Excellent B & Masters B, High in Trial from the A & B regular classes, High in Trial Champion of Record, Veteran, Rescue and Junior. Dogs entered in C classes are not eligible for High Scoring, HIT or HC awards.

Stockdog

Courses: 180 runs on Course H using 5 head of cattle; 180 runs on Course H, using 5 head of ducks; 180 runs on Course H, using 5 head of sheep; all clockwise, divided over three days. Sheep will be hair; cattle will be commercial beef crosses; ducks will be Khaki Campbell.

Policies: Entry is on a first-come, first-served basis by postmark date; an official waiting list will be maintained. Run order will be determined prior to the trial by a random draw by the trial committee and will be published in the National Catalog. Check posted run order daily for any changes. If an entry is pulled prior to the start of the first day of trial and that space can be filled from the official waiting list, a refund will be made. Substitutions are allowed of another dog owned or co-owned by the same owner who originally entered the dog. Bitches in season will run at the end of the day scheduled. Please notify entry clerk if moving up in division as soon as

possible prior to the Nationals. In order for the trial to run smoothly, we need helpers. Please consider volunteering and fill out the coupon found following the Submission Form.

Awards will include rosettes for 1st through 6th place class placements, qualifying score rosettes, HIT Cattle, HIT Ducks, HIT Sheep, Overall HIT, HC WTCH, HC Non-WTCH (only scores from the Advanced classes will count for dogs who have not completed their WTCH prior to October 4, 2020, HC Open (only scores from the Open classes will count), HC Started, HIT Open Working Junior, and HIT Working Junior Handler. HIT Veteran, Champion of Record and Rescue. Qualifying and non-qualifying scores will be used in the High Combined calculation.

Tracking

The tracking tests will be held in nearby agricultural fields and orchards (TD, TDX) and in city parks (TDU). We anticipate being able to offer 4-5 TD's and 2-3 TDX's. We may adjust these numbers upwards after walking the site in early 2020. We will post the any adjustment in numbers of tracks on the Nationals website. Draw information will be provided to each entrant. Directions to the test sites will be given to each entrant just prior to gathering for the TDU test. The Tracking Dog (TD) test is limited to 4 entries. The Tracking Dog Urban (TDU) test is limited to 4 entries. If the TDU entry limit is not reached, an additional TD may be added for each unused TDU. If the TD entry limit is not reached, and additional TDU may be added for each unused TD. The Tracking Dog Excellent (TDX) test is limited to 1 entry. The host club reserves the right to add or change the number of tracks. Certification or a copy of an equivalent title (see the tracking rules and regulations) must accompany all TD and TDU entries.

Uncertified dogs may enter the TD or TDU tests, but those entries will be drawn last in the draws for test entry. Bitches in season may participate after all other dogs have been tested, but they must be kept away from the other dogs and out of the tracking area prior to running their tracks.

Priority for draw order for TD/TDU test:

- 1. Aussies who are untitled in Tracking with a Certification or an equivalent title.
- 2. Aussies entered in Most Versatile Aussie competition that are titled in tracking.
- Aussies who are titled through TD2/TDU2 but not entered in Most Versatile Aussie competition.
- 4. Aussies who are uncertified.

Priority for draw order for TDX test:

- 1. Aussies who are titled through TD or TDU, not previously titled in TDX.
- 2. Aussies who have previously titled in TDX, who are entered in Most Versatile Aussie competition.
- 3. Aussies who have previously titled through TDX1.
- 4. Aussies with TDX2 or MT titles.
